INTRODUCTION

Recently, there have been growing cases of identity theft attacks in the new normal. In the Philippines, suspected digital fraud incidents more than doubled during the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic, data released by information solutions provider TransUnion LLC; cases of digital fraud rose by 119% during the March 11 to April 28 period from the January 1 to March 10 period; cases of online scams and computer-related identity theft have escalated during the community quarantine (PNP-ACG, 2020) and Identify theft, grew by 21.47 % from 298 to 362 (PhilStar, 2020).

Identity theft occurs when someone exploits your personal information — such as your name, Social Security number, and birthdate — to mimic you for financial advantage. They could use that information to deplete your bank and investment accounts, open new credit lines in your name, obtain utility service, steal your tax refund, obtain medical treatment, or provide authorities with your name and address if they were arrested. Since the pandemic started, identity theft cases spiked in the new normal (Kagan, 2021). This research focuses on identity theft awareness
