INTRODUCTION

Sugarcane (Saccharum officinarum)L.) is widely grown in many provinces of the Philippines. This is one of the leading crop exports and provides the government several million pesos in annual revenues.

Mill owners take the sugarcane crop at contract prices or on established price for the season. Payments are made to each grower according to sucrose content of the cane as determined in sugar.

In Calaca, Batangas, the farmers are largely dependent on sugarcane production for their livelihood. It can be observed that each year the area planted to sugarcane increa-
