It is important to note that medical social workers are most often referred to as "social workers," but occasionally may have other titles, including case/care manager.

The basic concept of medical social worker is not new, but its application to new areas, to larger groups in the community, to apparently well people as well as to sick individuals, is new. In dealing with people who are ill, regardless of age, the kind of the duration of the illness, or the communicability of the disease, the medical social must understand the role of emotions and the meaning of behavior in illness. He or she must understand the relationship and influence of social factors on ill health, and she be able to utilize the community resources that are best suited to the needs of that individual patient and his family.
