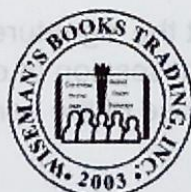

BRIAN B. GUERRERO



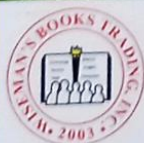
