HEMATIC ANALYSIS OF SELECTED FILIPINO DRAMA MOVIES BY CHITO ROÑO AND JOEL LAMAMUAN

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ABSTRACT

The study is a thematic analysis of selected Filipino drama movies by Chito Roño and Joel Lamangan. It determined the themes depicted in *Bata*, *Bata...Paano ka Ginawa?*, *Laro sa Baga*, *Bulaklak ng Maynila* and *Mila*.

The objectives of the study were to: determine the themes depicted in the films; identify the scenes/ dialogues reflecting the themes of the four movies; and identify the events when the films were produced.

The researchers identified the themes depicted in four selected movies, and employed the thematic table and content analysis forms as the research instruments of the study.

The latter was adapted from the study of Ma. Celeste M. Borsoto (2001) entiled, "Mga Babae ni Direk: A Comparative Content Analysis on the Films of Carlos Siguion-Reyna and his portrayal of the Filipino Women as Compared to Marilu Diaz-Abaya's Portrayal in her films and the way it is Presented in Philippine Society," and thematic table used in analyzing the content of the film was the same instrument used by Natalie Rose Padua in her work entitled, "The Portrayal of Filipino Women in the Contemporary Radio Soap Operas" as also used by Jovelle Torres and Angelito Antic (2002) in their thesis entitled, "The Image of the Filipina:

A Textual Interpretation of Mila. In addition, it also discussed the effects, which reflected the themes used in various films.

The thematic table discussed the themes used in the selected films; scenes and dialogues were categorized and presented the critical analysis of each theme. This instrument is the most appropriate for a relatively easier analysis.

The different themes that the researchers identified, analyzed and examined were: womanhood and motherhood such as love to her husband, love for her children and love for her students; identity of strength; sexual abuse; drug addiction; the corruption of power; violence against woman; and martyrs as sign of weakness were concretely depicted in *Bata, Bata...Paano ka Ginawa*?, *Laro sa Baga, Bulaklak ng Maynila*, and *Mila*.

Moreover, the selected movies not only identified themes, but it also discussed the themes, which reflect the events of the country when those films were produced from 1998 to 2001. The themes were based on the filmmakers' observation in the society to live up the audience experiences.

Therefore, the researchers would like to recommend that the directors and the scriptwriters must create and conceptualized more films or themes similar to *Bata*, *Bata...Paano ka Ginawa?*, *Laro sa Baga*, *Bulaklak ng Maynila* and *Mila* for the movie goers' understanding of the present societal problems. To the producers, they should produce more films like the four selected ones.

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INTRODUCTION

The youngest of the Philippine arts, film has evolved to become the most of all art forms. It reflects the culture and the beliefs of the people it caters to and most times, is the one that shapes their consciousness. It was in 1919 when movies became dominant in the Philippines, considered as one national form of entertainment depicting reality. Simply because movies present stories that happen in real life.

In the age of complex developed society, movie producers ventured in to various kinds of films with formats ranging from action to comedy to drama. In the Philippines, drama movies have been the most celebrated type of film with the
