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ABSTRACT

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The study was conducted from August 2016 to May 2017 to assess the dispute resolution of *Katarungang Pambarangay* in the Municipality of Indang, Cavite. Specifically, it determined the process of *Katarungang Pambarangay* in terms of mediation, conciliation and arbitration, the problem encountered by the implementer and disputants in terms of mediation, conciliation and arbitration and the proposed solution of the implementer and disputants on the problem encountered during dispute resolution.

Descriptive qualitative method of research was used in this study for deeper understanding of its variables. It is a set of research technique in which data is obtained from a relatively group of participants and is focused on the significance of observation made in the study. The researchers used qualitative research to verify the problems, formulate question and analyse the study. The researchers will analyse the experiences of and the process they used in the barangay officials, disputants KatarungangPambarangay.

Findings implies that *Katarungang Pambarangay* is implemented in the Municipality of Indang, Cavite, but still there were processes that were not followed by some implementer. The absence and lack of cooperation of the respondent were the usual problem encountered by the implementer and disputants. Familiarize, educate and information drive were the proposed solution of the implementer and disputants.

Moreover, it is noteworthy that there were implementer who does not know the process of settling of disputes, although the *lupon* still exert efforts to perform their duties and function, lack of knowledge would affect the service delivery of the *Katarungang Pambarangay*.

Thus, it is recommended for the DILG, which is the national agency tasked with providing technical assistance to LGUs could take a more active involvement in strengthening the *Katarungang Pambarangay* and should be in frontline in training barangay officials. To implement the program effectively, there must be a strong administrative and operational support, shared vision and inter agency linkage to achieve the total service quality. It is also recommended to conduct seminars, workshops and to provide manual of procedure operation to enhance the capability and skills of the implementer.

INTRODUCTION

Conflicts are unavoidable circumstances which form part of the daily situation in every barangay. People faces problem in dealing with one another, thus, it is one of the conditions set upon social beings. After all, two people cannot be expected to agree on everything all the time. Learning how to deal with conflict – rather than avoiding it – is crucial. When conflict is mismanaged, it can cause great harm to a relationship. But when handled in a respectful positive way, conflict provides an opportunity to strengthen the bond between two people (Segal and Smith, 2016). This statement is further supported by Baumgardner (2012), that indeed conflict is part of life. It is a situation in which people have incompatible interests, goals, principles or feelings and experiences. It is a discomforting experience.
