ABSTARCT

BENCTIO, LYN N. Demographic Profile and Level of Philanthropy of Selected Members of Philippine Air Force and Philippine National Police in Cavite. A Thesis Manuscript Submitted to the Faculty of Department Social Sciences and Humanities, Cavite State University, Indang Cavite. April 2009. Thesis Adviser Ms. Vivian D. Rogando.

This study was conducted to determine the philanthropy level of Philippine Air Force and Philippine National Police in Cavite.

It has aimed to: (1) describe the demographic profile of the respondents in terms of age, civil status, religion, educational background, income, and years in service; (2) to determine the level of philanthropy of the respondents in terms of motivation, challenges encountered, social work, opportunities and advantages; (3) know if there is a significant difference in philanthropy level between Philippine Air Force and Philippine National Police; and (4) know if there is a significant relationship between level of philanthropy and demographic profile of Philippine Air Force and Philippine National Police.

This study was conducted from November 2008 to January 2009 at Cavite City (Sangly Point), Dasmariñas Police Station, Dasmariñas Cavite and Trece Martires City Police Station, Trece Martires City.

The respondents were 140 which of 70 from the PAF while 25 from Trece Martires City Police Station; and 45 from Dasmariñas Police Station.

The results revealed that the PAF and PNP have a very high level of philanthropy while the relationship between the philanthropy level and demographic profile of the respondents is not significant.
